Richard Aaron Green, 39, returned to our Heavenly Father's arms on Tuesday, March 21, 2017. He had been struggling with heart problems for some years.

Aaron was born February 4, 1978 in Provo, Utah to Richard Bruce and Marsha Shurtz Green. He received his public schooling in Bakersfield, California, where he was active in swimming, choir and theater. The family moved back to Provo Aaron's Junior year of High School. At Provo High School, he joined the choir and enjoyed music there, graduating in 1996.

Aaron served a full-time mission to the Pennsylvania, Pittsburg mission serving in Ohio, New York, West Virginia and Pennsylvania. One year after completing his mission Aaron married Marcie Adamson. Together they had two children, Richard Joshua and Kaytlin Breanne. Aaron and Marcie were later divorced.

A man of many trades, Aaron worked installing coolers, vinyl fencing and security systems, in security tech support and in plumbing and apartment maintenance.

Upon returning to school, Aaron studied Bio Technology and lacked only 2 classes for his degree. Aaron was currently employed as a lab tech for the Micro Biology Department at UVU. He had many close and dear friendships with the faculty and staff there. He was happiest in the lab.

Aaron's interests included science, reading, motorcycles, leatherworking, gaming, movies and D&D. In 2016, he began volunteering at the Utah State Prison in Draper, where he was a tenor in the Oquirrh Branch Choir and attended Sunday meetings.

Aaron is remembered as a kind, generous and fun loving man, and a loyal and ready friend.

He is survived by his children, Richard Joshua and Kaytlin Breanne; parents, Richard

Bruce and Marsha Shurtz Green; grandparents, Grace Cawley Green, Royden and Alene Shurtz; sister, Jordan (Eric) Anderson and brother, Andrew Spencer (Charlotte Hendricksen) Green and 8 nieces and nephews.
