Ann served faithfully for her Church for many years, in a variety of different callings, especially Primary and Cub Scouts. Her testimony was one that you couldn't forget if you were privileged to hear it from her. She wasn't afraid to share her shortcomings if it meant she could uplift others. Her faith in the Savior and His divine role in her life was inspiring to everyone around her.

Ann worked for several years with special needs adults. She always talked about how dear they were to her and how much she loved the people she worked with. Ann was passionate about mental health. She wanted to understand health conditions and how to help, as well as be an advocate for those without a clear voice of their own.

Ann was passionate about life and making memories to cherish forever. We will continue to make memories in her honor as we remember the countless wonderful memories she graced us with during her time here on earth.

Ann is survived by her loving husband, Dominique Replogle; her four beautiful children, Mackenzie, Jayden, Madison, and Landen; her mother Melanee Meldrum; her siblings, Irene Christensen, Mark Meldrum, Lorraine Dansie, Phillip Meldrum, and Gordon Meldrum; her many nephews and nieces and their families.

Ann is preceded in death by her father, Larry Joe Meldrum (2010), her brother-in-law Daryl Christensen (2005), and her Grandmother (in-law) Joan Willner (2014).
