BarDee is survived by her husband Raymond, daughter Jennifer (Robert), son Scott (Wendy), son Troy (Suzy), son Chris (Sonja), 15 grandchildren, and 3 great grandchildren.

She will be missed more than we can ever express. We are so grateful for such an incredible woman who has touched and shaped our lives.
