



## Carol S. Woolley

March 6, 1927 - June 6, 2016

Marjorie Carol Springman Woolley made a graceful exit from this life Monday, June 6, 2016 at home with her son Michael and his family after a short period of failing health. Carol was born March 6, 1927, to Carl Frederick Springman and Nora Serena Smart, joining her older sister Dorothy (Roy Margrave), all of whom preceded her in death. Carol attended Highland Park Elementary, Irving Jr. High, East High School, and the University of Utah where she met Dee Richard Woolley. She married Dee August 27, 1950, and arranged as a surprise to be sealed to him and their two sons May 10, 2012, on the one-year anniversary of Dee's passing.

Carol spent her life caring for her loved ones. As a young woman, she and her mother Nora cared for Carol's grandmother, Nora Elvina Smart, who lived with them during her final years. Before marrying Dee, Carol cared for her grandmother Rosa Springman. Carol loved and cared for her family during the next years until the time came that her mother, Nora, needed daily love and care until her passing. After her mother's death, Carol took daily care of her father, Carl, for 8 years until his death. Carol then assisted in the care of her mother-in-law, Ivy Woolley. Finally, Carol cared for her husband, Dee, during his final homebound years until his passing. She served in many capacities in the LDS Church, happy to do anything asked of her as long as she did not have to ask others to work. After decades of caring for everyone around her, she had a chance to receive love and care. Mike and Debbie built an apartment for her in their home. Carol moved there in October of 2014, allowing Mike, Debbie, and their family to give her the kind of love and service she had given so many others. She appreciated and loved them for providing a safe, worry-free place for her but she was especially, sweetly, expressively grateful for their tender love and care from the first week of May when she took to her bed until her passing a month later.
