On July 15, 2018, heaven gained a beautiful angel, Frances Louise Stillman Fehr, after enduring a courageous 8-year battle with Alzheimer's.

Frances was born on October 9, 1930 to Garrie Wayne and Florence Louise Brown Stillman. She was the fourth of five children, with older brothers Bob, Dick and Garry, and younger sister Marilyn. She grew up in East Millcreek, and spoke fondly of spending her childhood climbing fruit trees in the family's orchard with her best friend and cousin Charlie. Frances graduated from Granite High School and later attended the University of Utah, where she was a member of Phi Beta Phi Sorority.

She married her high school sweetheart, Robert M. Fehr and followed him to Kansas and Missouri as he served in the Air Force division of the National Guard during the Korean War. While her husband served in the military, Frances worked in the stockyards. When she returned home to Salt Lake City, she worked as a secretary for Standard Oil Co. Frances raised 3 children in the Holladay area of Salt Lake City. The family later moved to Highland, Utah where they remained. For a time, she worked as bookkeeper for The Optical Shop and Provo Optical, both family owned businesses.

Frances was a talented cook, seamstress and painter. She also enjoyed doll making and was especially skilled at sculpting doll heads and hands from clay. Frances loved to read anything she could get her hands on. She could win anyone at the game Trivial Pursuit and could not pass up a crossword puzzle. Along with her husband, Frances had a love for the Native American culture and their artwork, especially jewelry and pottery. She and her husband enjoyed traveling in pursuit of their hobbies, visiting their daughter's family in Texas, and were frequently seen in attendance at the Cutting Horse World Championship Futurity in Fort Worth, Texas.

Frances had a love for all animals and enjoyed the many horses, dogs, and cats that the family had as pets through the years. She leaves behind two cats that we believe God sent to comfort her through Alzheimer's.

She was a loving daughter, sister, wife, mother, and grandmother. Family was what mattered most to her in this life. She excelled at loving and serving her family. Frances had a love for all people, and never knew a stranger. Her large circle of friends was easy to enter into, and once in that circle, you remained her friend for life.
