July 21, 1955 - September 22, 2019

Charles Jeffrey Brady, 64, passed away surrounded by his family on Sunday, September 22, 2019 in Provo, UT. Jeff was born to Max Brady and Roberta Jean Culver on July 21, 1955 in Manassa, CO. He is preceded in death by his beloved stepfather, Clifton Eugene Culver, and stepson, Hunter Karl Reynolds.

Jeff was a cowboy at heart, and his life and accomplishments were a result of the old-fashioned self-reliance and discipline he valued. He fought hard, showing unbelievable grit to the end. Jeff was hard-working, humble, kind, and had an inexhaustible gift for service to his family, friends, and church. Jeff was at his best when lending his time, labor, and sharp mind to those around him. Jeff's appreciation for the peace and beauty found in nature was often manifested in his frequent visits to his Colorado-based cabin, where he took time off to relax by working sun-up to sun-down on a never-ending list of projects.

Jeff graduated from Brigham Young University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Chemistry in 1979 and continued to pursue education in his field throughout his life. He was a lifelong member of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Orem, UT. Accepting the call in 1975, Jeff faithfully served a two-year mission in Buenos Aires, Argentina.

Jeff is survived by his two girls, daughters Marisa Jean and Macie Rae Brady; stepdaughter, Diana Reynolds; loving wife, Sheila Hansen Reynolds Brady; mother, Jean Culver; brother, Brent Brady; and his two sisters, Sharri Headrick and Nancy Wood.
