Melvin P Anderson passed away in the early morning hours of Sunday, December 30, 2018. He was born March 7, 1932. His parents were Evans L. and Liliane Anderson.

Melvin attended all the public schools in Lehi and graduated from high school in 1950. He was a self-taught carpenter and was self-employed for most of his adult life. He had many interests including rodeo, horse drawn carriages and buggies (buggy rides too), horseback riding, gardening and yard work. He built a number of horse drawn vehicles including the Silver Band Wagon for Lehi. He was active in services in The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. He had various callings in the priesthood and missionary service.

He married his sweetheart Dona May Hansen on May 27, 1952. They had two children, Donald and Melva. Together Melvin and Dona formed a partnership and served in the Civic Improvement Association chairing the Roundup Queen contest. Many lasting friendships were formed through this service.

Melvin is survived by his children, Donald (Becky), Melva and six grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren. He is preceded in death by his wife Dona who died May 2nd of this year.
