Surrounded by family, Rebecca (Becca) Jackson’s spirit was released from the pains and limitations of her physical body and graduated on to the next stage of her eternal life.

Becca seemed eager to join the Jackson family when she arrived on July 11, 1982, 10 weeks earlier than expected, while the family was vacationing in Arizona.

Growing up in Fairfield, CA, Becca loved going to school and socializing with classmates and teachers. When she moved with her family to Provo, UT, she continued to be a blessing in peoples’ lives. Her positive attitude with her cerebral palsy and her patience through many illnesses was an inspiration to countless individuals. They loved to see her smile and felt happier after having spent time with her.

She had a deep love of the gospel, attended seminary in Fairfield and received her endowments in the Provo temple in 2007. She served as a Youth Camp Leader at the church camp Liahona in California.

Becca loved to spend time with her family and watch funny movies with whoever had a good sense of humor like her. If you were watching a movie with her that she had seen before, she would anticipate the funny parts and start laughing just before the scene came on the screen.

She enjoyed traveling with her family, whether by planes, trains, or automobiles. In 1984 she went on a camping trip in the family van to Nevada, Utah, Idaho, Montana, Washington, and Oregon. While living in Fremont, California, she enjoyed trips on the BART train to San Francisco. In 2000 she flew to London with Verla, Harold, Stephanie and Rachel for a two week British holiday where she visited Oxford University and the Preston temple where her dad served his mission.

She attended the STEPS program in Orem, a wonderful center for physically and developmentally challenged adults where she made many friends, worked on craft projects, watched movies, and generally hung out. We wish to extend many thanks to the staff at STEPS that took good care of her.

She was always up for an adventure, whether it was snow skiing with her dad, car racing with her big brother Rex, camping with friends, or tubing with Dad behind the family boat.

Becca is survived by her parents Harold and Verla King Jackson, her siblings Shirley (Brian) Morris, Glenn (Sara) Jackson, Rex (Emily) Jackson, Lisa (Will) Ashby, Stephanie (Carlos) Bassett, and Rachel (Trevor) Gonthier, as well as dozens of adoring nieces and nephews who loved to catch a ride with her on her wheelchair. The family wishes to thank the many home health aides that came, morning and night, to care for her daily needs as well as all the respite workers who lived in our basement apartment and helped care for her. Our aging memories makes it difficult to mention everyone by name but you know who you are. We love you all.

We will celebrate her life on Friday, August 2nd at 11:00 am in The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints chapel at 2950 N. Canyon Road, Provo, UT. You may visit with us and her brothers and sisters Thursday evening from 7-9 pm and Friday morning from 9-10:30 am prior to the funeral service.
