August 15, 1950 - March 22, 2017

Sheila M. Myers Lozer passed away at the age of 66, at her home in Orem, UT. She had inspired all her family, friends, doctors, nurses and caretakers with her brave and courageous fight against the cancer that took her life in the end. She met it with a positive and uplifting attitude, and now has joined her precious daughter, Kristie, in the arms of her Heavenly Father.

She was born on August 15, 1950 in her Provo, Utah home, the fourth child of Clifford Oliver and Marion Hardy Myers. She joined Kay, Robert (Bob) Gile and Sue. Her brother Jay Ivor joined the family when she was six years old. Other siblings were born to Clifford in later years after he remarried including Sonya, Shauna and Aaron Myers. The family also includes half brothers, Charles Hepworth and Ross and Bob Conk. She married David Walton Lozer on February 26, 1972. Their only child, Kristie Kay, passed away in 2001, leaving Sheila to raise her four-year-old grandson, David Pearce. Sheila's second husband, Jim Dufur, brought Sheila a step-daughter, Jackie Oglesby, whom she loved with her whole heart as her own.

Sheila was preceded in death by both parents and many beloved family members, including daughter Kristie Kay, brother Bob Myers, and half-sister Sonya Myers.
