April 30, 1933 - October 3, 2021

Cherished sister, aunt, and friend, Virginia Wilson passed away on Sunday, October 3, 2021. Virginia was born in Wilson Canyon, Garfield County, on April 30, 1933. She was the daughter of Jesse Stephen and Lilith Porter Wilson.

She attended elementary school in Hatch, UT, graduated from Panguitch High School, and received her BA in Education from Brigham Young University. She taught school for two years, earning enough money to then serve a mission in Uruguay for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Upon returning home, she served as a secretary to Gordon B. Hinckley in the missionary department of the church, then in that capacity for several other companies.

She was an avid family historian and shared her talents with many; including serving a mission at the family history center and as a family history consultant. She was the family expert on genealogy and loved to share the stories of her ancestors. She was a member of the Daughters of the Utah Pioneers.

She was dedicated in her service to the church, including loving the children in her Primary classes. Throughout her life, she cared for and maintained her home and yard. Her love of flowers and her garden kept her busy.

She learned to care for others as the oldest daughter in a family of 13 siblings: Russell (Yvonne), Lloyd (Charlene), Helen Wilkes (Melvin), Marba Lazenby (Ferrell), Marie Davis (Lyle), Richard (Carolyn), Wayne (Wanda), Kent (Kay), Hugh (Jacki), Karl (LaPriel), Carolyn Poulsen (Scott), and Robert (Sabrina). Until recently, she could name all 79 of her nieces and nephews.

Preceded in death by her parents, Jesse and Lilith, siblings and spouses, Russell, Melvin, Wayne, Wanda, and nephews Curtis Lazenby, Jeffery Wilson, and Brooks Miramontes.

There will be a Viewing at the Hillsdale Cemetery on Thursday, October 7th, at 12:30 p.m,
