



## Wade Miles Christensen

Wade Miles Christensen, 84, passed away peacefully on December 11, 2017, in Springville, Utah. Born in Banida, Idaho, to Joseph and Goldie Christensen, he spent his growing-up years on the family farm in Banida.

In 1951, Wade graduated from Preston High School. Only a few days after his graduation, he married his high school sweetheart, Zoe Andreasen, in the Logan Utah Temple.
