He attended Sharon Elementary, Canyon View Jr. High and Orem High School. He also studied film editing and scripting at Utah Valley University. During that time he was staff on Breaking Pointe CW, Peloton, and staff with a cameo on The Mistle-tones on abc family.

He also fulfilled a dream to work in New York City in the film industry. He loved to sample food throughout the city and show his visiting friends and family his favorite spots. Such as The City Diner, Macy's Wood Stairs, Rockefeller Center, and loved to hang out in
