Wayne Clark, age 92, graduated from this mortal life on Sunday, October 15, 2017 and went to attend a wonderful family reunion with his father and mother, his siblings and his precious son, Douglas Ryan, who died in his infancy.

He will be missed by his wife, Annette Hill Clark, his son and daughter-in-law, Steve and Amy Clark, with whom he and Annette made their home in Pleasant Grove, UT, his daughters, Susie Noland, Lesli (Brad) Burnside, Shelli (Bryan) Willey, Kerilee Burton, Colette (Eric) Singleton, and LeeAnne (Jerry) Rogers. He is also survived by 27 grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

Wayne was born on January 31, 1925 to Lawrence Walter Clark and Bernetta Ellis in Morgan, UT. When he was a boy, his father gave him the choice of getting up early to milk the cows or practice the piano; he became an accomplished pianist! Nonetheless, he milked his share of cows and was a farmer at heart. He played the trumpet in the school band. He was the Morgan High Cheer King and sang all the words to the fight song just the day before he passed. He was drafted and served in the Army Air Corps during WWII. After the war, he worked on the family farm to support his older brother on his mission. When Rich returned, Wayne was able to serve a mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in the East Central States. (He could still sing every word to the mission song as well!) He graduated from BYU with a degree in accounting. He had returned to Brigham Young to work further on his Masters Degree when he met his "ever-lovin". He married Annette Hill on October 1, 1958 in the Logan UT Temple.

He taught math in the Jordan School district for 30 years. To prepare for seven future wedding receptions, together, he and Annette built Silvercrest Wedding Center in Sandy, UT in 1974. Wayne knew the value of hard work. His children have great memories of working alongside their Dad. He was washing the last dish, making slush and taking care

of the grounds, while teaching and loving his family. Just for fun, after he retired, he worked at Fidelity Investments. He loved to travel with Annette and saw many parts of the world. Throughout his eighties, he loved assisting his son Steve at the car auction, buying and selling cars. Everyone who knew Wayne, knew of his passion for cars! He missed being an Uber driver by only a decade!

Wayne firmly believed that “actions speak louder than words” as was evidenced by his life and never-ending support for his wife, children and those around him. He was a faithful member of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. He was a lifelong missionary and loved sharing the gospel through word and song. He is singing in the heavenly choirs and preparing mansions for his family until we meet again.


